Gifts in wills play a huge part in all that the League has achieved.

Around half of all income received comes from aifts in wills bequeathed by those who want to see an end to cruel sports for good. Gifts in wills have enabled us to purchase and maintain our vital sanctuaries to offer a safe haven for wildlife at risk from hunts. They have supported the campaigning that has achieved landmark legislation including the Hunting Act 2004, Protection of Wild Mammals Act 2002, Justice Act 2015 and Hunting with Dogs (Scotland) Bill, as well as the restrictions imposed on landowners who still allow hunting on their land.

Making a will is the only way to ensure your wishes are followed after you've gone and that those you care about most are taken care of. If you can, please consider a gift to the League after you have taken care of your loved ones.

If you would like to leave the League a gift in your will, you should discuss it with your solicitor. You can make a gift to the League in three main ways:

A share of your estate.

Known as a residuary bequest, it is a percentage of what remains of your estate after all other gifts and expenses have been paid and therefore retains its relative value over time.

A specific sum.

Known as a pecuniary bequest, a gift of a set amount e.g. £1,000. This type of gift often decreases in value over time as the cost of living rises.

A specific item.

A valuable item such as an antique, painting, property or shares that you own.
